

TRAVEL MANAGEMENT

Having a first-hand experience travelling through remote Australia and seeing how the road conditions continually change, we have put this information together to ensure your Van Cruiser caravan is handled in the correct way, for the safety of our clients travelling.

As the outback can be unrelenting, it is paramount that you are aware of the types of roads that you may be travelling on. The roads can consist of many kilometres of corrugations and deep gutters that can suddenly creep up without notice. There are also large rocks on these roads that may not be visual from a distance which will create a sudden hard impact, as well as heavy dust that will affect what is ahead of you, reducing visibility. You MUST travel to suit these conditions. Reduce your tyre pressures to 25 -35 PSI and a safe travel speed of 40 km per hour.

We are governed by law to keep permanent ventilation open, therefore dust coming into the caravan is unavoidable.

As these roads and terrain are continually changing, it is all about safety and how the Van Cruiser caravan will perform. We have seen firsthand how fatigue and misuse of the caravan can cause items to fail.
